SAN JOSE GREENPRINT STRATEGIC PLAN

Parks and trails has always been an important issue to the neighborhood, so there should be interest in the upcoming city greenprint meetings. The Greenprint is the City's 20-Year Strategic Plan for Parks, Recreational Facilities and Programs. It is a guide for City staff and policy makers in the day to day decision making process, which provides opportunities to improve resident health and wellness through parks, recreational programs and facilities. The updated plan will be presented in spring 2008 and will be the basis of the recreational input into the City of San Jose's General Plan. Input is requested at the following public meetings:
